### **SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES**

#### **First-aid Measures**

#### Inhalation

Move to fresh air. Keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Get medical advice or attention if you feel unwell or are concerned.

#### **Skin Contact**

Avoid direct contact. Wear chemical protective clothing if necessary. Take off immediately contaminated clothing, shoes and leather goods (e.g. watchbands, belts). ### **Eye Contact**

### Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures

Evacuate the area immediately. Isolate the hazard area. Keep out unnecessary and unprotected personnel. # **Precautions for Safe Handling**
