#### **Precautionary Statements**

#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is

difficult, give oxygen. If symptoms develop and persist, get medical attention.

Skin contact: Immediately flush skin with plenty of water (using soap, if available). Remove

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# 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

Special firefighting procedures: Wear self-contained breathing apparatus and full protective clothing, such as

turn-out gear.

Unusual fire or explosion hazards: Closed containers may rupture (due to build up of pressure) when exposed to

extreme heat. In case of fire, keep containers cool with water spray. Vapors

are heavier than air and may travel to ignition sources and flash back.

**Hazardous combustion products:** Oxides of carbon. Irritating vapors.

### 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
